

# NAUGUT

Hydrosoluble complementary feed in oral solution

## **COMPOSITION**

Propylene glycol	74,3 %
Mono, di and triglycerides of butyric acid (C4)	12,1 %
Mono, di and triglycerides of short and medium-chain fatty acids (C3, C8 and C10)	5,3 %

### Additives per litre

Lactic acid (1a270)	69,5 g
Carvacrol	11,0 g
Cinnamaldehyde	11,0 g

### **PROPERTIES**

- Important source of butyric acid in newborns with an immature digestive system.
- Contributes to the development of intestinal villi, exerting an anti-inflammatory and stimulant of the local immune system, and reinforcing the mucosal cell junctions.
- Helps to promote intestinal eubiosis.
- The synergies between lactic acid, glycerides of medium chain fatty acids and essential oils contribute to the control of enteropathogens.
- Helps to reduce the symptoms derived from enteric processes in newborns, as well as their incidence.

### **INDICATIONS AND USES**

**Target species:** Newborn piglets, calves, kids, lambs and bunnies. **Period of use:** First weeks of life. **Indications:** Enteric processes in newborns: prevention, treatment and convalescence.

### **DOSAGE AND ADMINISTRATION**

To be administered orally. Apply in the mouth with the dispenser, 1 - 2 puffs (1 - 2 ml) per animal, between 24 and 48 hours of life. Repeat dose 24-72 hours later if diarrhoea appears and/or symptoms do not subside.

#### **STORAGE**

Store in a cool and dry place and protected from light.

SHELF-LIFE 24 months.
